Our largest developed Park, and covers over **10,000 acres**, 4 towns - Allenstown, Deerfield, Candia & Hooksett; including 2 counties.

THE BEGINNINGS OF BEAR BROOK

During the 1930s, the Civil Conservation Corps constructed many of the buildings at the Park along with its trail system. In 1941, the Park was leased to the State of NH, and was given the title in 1943.

The CCC at Bear Brook helped construct many of the Park's famous landmarks: Bear Hill Pond camps, Broken Boulder Trail, Catamount Pond Bathhouse and Spruce Pond Camp, which now houses the Student Conservation Association, and multiple buildings in what is now our museum complex.

Today, the CCC buildings at Bear Brook State Park are historically significant and it's one of the few relatively intact camps in the entire nation.
