Camping Information

About the Campground

The campground is open for reservable stays from Memorial Day weekend through Columbus Day weekend.

Facilities, Services and Amenities

A camp store, coin-operated showers, dump station, playground, ice and firewood are available. Boat rentals are available on Memorial Day weekend and July through August.

Activities

Enjoy trout fishing, swimming, canoeing, and hiking. Boats are not to exceed trolling speed.

Making a Reservation

Reservations may be made by calling ReserveAmerica at 1-877-nhparks (1-877-647-2757), or online at www.nhstateparks.org. Reservations for youth group camping are not available online.

About the Policies

- Campers with a reservation must register at the campground office between 1 pm and 8 pm. Check-out time is 11 am.
- Only two vehicles are allowed per campsite, including visitor vehicles. Overflow parking is available at the main parking lot by the registration office.
- Payment due upon registration may be made by cash, voucher, money order, Mastercard, Visa or Discover.
- The license plate number is needed to register.
- Visitors are required to pay the day-use fee and may visit in the campground during posted visitor hours.
- Quiet hours are 10 pm to 7 am. No loud radios.
- Pets are not allowed in the park.
- The beach is open during daylight hours only.
- Campers must dispose of trash daily at the dumpster location, across from the Registration Office. This dumpster is for campers only.
- Do not wash dishes or brush teeth at the outside water stations. Do not wash dishes in the bathroom sinks.
- Cutting standing trees or shrubs and using power saws is prohibited.
- Pets, RVs are not permitted in youth group areas.
- Firewood is a major carrier of exotic insects and tree diseases. Please do not bring firewood from out-of-state locations.

For Your Safety

Do not invite bears or raccoons into the campground or to your campsite. Keep a clean site by disposing of food waste properly and securing all food items in your vehicle at night. Coolers left out are easily opened by raccoons or destroyed by bears. Feeding the ducks attracts large numbers to the swimming area where they become a health concern. Be sure to keep valuables locked inside your vehicle when not in use.
